

What changes are there from admission to review for community child and adolescent mental health services?



This infographic uses HoNOSCA (Health of the Nation Outcome Scales - Child and Adolescent) data from child and adolescent mental health services from July 2020 to June 2021, focusing on community HoNOSCA admission and review collections. Review collections are completed every three months and review other collections can be collected at any time, both collections are included in this infographic. HoNOSCA is a simple measure used in child and adolescent services. It has 15 items scored from 0 to 4 where 0 is no problem and 4 is a serious problem.

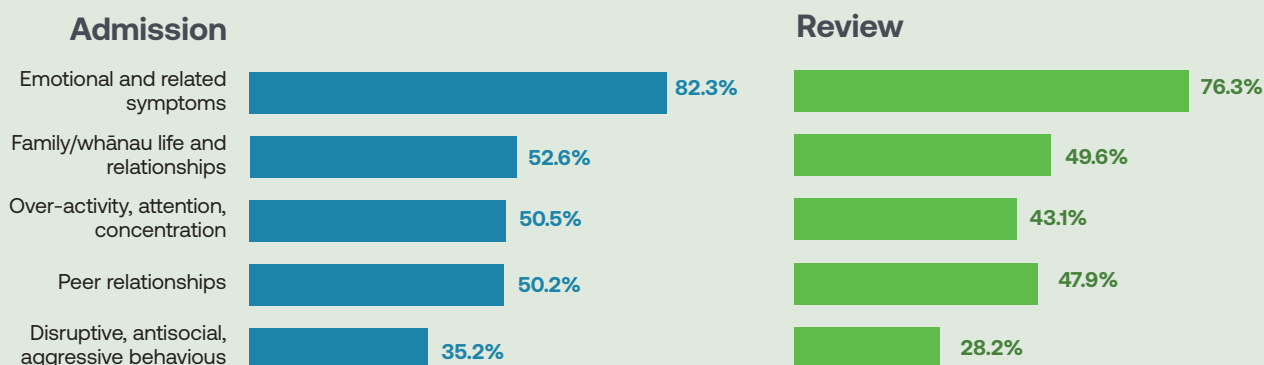
Average number of items which are clinically significant on admission

Clinically significant is when the item has a score of 2 to 4 for HoNOSCA. (moderate to severe problems).



Top 5 items with highest percentage which are clinically significant

Index of severity

Sub clinical = all items <2, mild = at least one item >1 and all items <3, moderate = at least one item >=3, severe = at least 2 items >=3 using first 13 items.
