The following table shows the number of Infants 0 to 47 months seen over one year period, up to March 2023. These numbers are taken from PRIMHD and reflect the numbers of Infants who would be eligible to have a HoNOSI outcome measure completed.

HoNOSI (Health of the nation outcome scales) has been mandated for collection by Infant mental health services from 1 July 2024. HoNOSI is a simple 15 scale outcome measure which applies to Infants aged between 0 and 47 months.

As can be seen from this data the three Auckland based Te Whatu Ora district services are recording the majority of Infants seen between April 2022 and March 2023, with Auckland Te Whatu Ora service recording the most for babies aged 0 to 11 months.
